We are part of this extensive network of 49 libraries who are here to provide you access to all the materials you seek. There is NO charge for placing holds and checking out materials from any of our 49 member libraries.

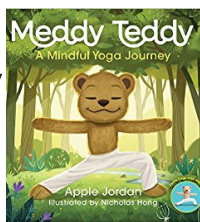

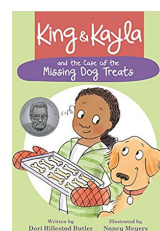

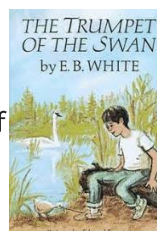
